## Registration and Submissions

Presenters must register to attend the Symposium by following the instructions for **registration** [link] on the Symposium website. Please note that you need to book your own accommodation and **early booking of accommodation is strongly recommended**.

The deadline for submissions is **30 April 2023**. Please be aware that, although every single offer is appreciated, submissions will be treated on the basis of their relevance to the Symposium theme. You will hear whether or not your submission has been accepted before the **Early Bird registration deadline of 1 June**.

We encourage participants to present their work regarding the conference theme in one of two forms:

- as a short in-person presentation (in a 30-minute slot)
- as an experiential workshop (90 minutes). Workshops may be offered either in person or online and will take place in parallel.
